Pathways Thinking

Supporting students in identifying their personal interests, strengths, needs, and aspirations and in using this knowledge of themselves to inform their choices of programs and learning opportunities

Providing a range of diverse and engaging learning opportunities, courses, and programs, both in and outside the classroom, that meet the interests strengths, needs, and aspirations of the students and honour all postsecondary destinations — apprenticeship training, college, community living, university, and the workplace.



University Pathway Example

Student born 1994 in Colombia.

High school transcript is available and translated.

Jobs included: Student worked at Tim Hortons and Starbucks, student worked as a cashier at Osh Kosh, and currently has own business (opened a small family restaurant that she runs with her husband).

Other activities: Parent, married, loves crafts and has a craft store on Etsy, loves to go to church and volunteers at church every Sunday (teaching kids Spanish).

Student wants to be a Registered Nurse and always wanted to go to university (U of T or McMaster University).

College Pathway Example

Student born 1985 in Saudi Arabia.

University degrees in Health Services and Computer Programming.

High school transcript is available and translated.

Jobs included: Cashier, Tailor, Booking Appointments in Dental office.

Other activities: Parent, Math tutor for elementary aged students.

Not currently working, on Ontario Works.

Student wants to be an RPN at the College.

Workplace Pathway Example #1 Student born in Ontario in 1995 and attended school in Ontario until Grade 10.

Transcript available, 14 credits, all at Gr. 9/10 level.

History and Gr. 10 English missing.

Literacy test and community hours NOT complete.

Lots of proof of work experience, welder, construction, concrete, currently working.

Life skills: Parent, budgeting, plays guitar in a band for several years.

Wants to complete OSSD needed for managerial position at current company.

Workplace Pathway Example #2

Student born in Ontario in 1972, attended school in Ontario until Grade 11. Transcript available, 23 credits, all at Gr. 9/10/11 level credits, missing grade 12 English). Student has a two year post-secondary diploma in Business Marketing (Durham College), went to college as a mature student.

Lots of proof of work experience, currently has a career in robotics, works as a certified functional safety engineer and has two German certifications in industrial machinery, part owner of a marketing company.

Life skills: parent, budgeting, works out every day and does kickboxing, volunteers at a long term home and Red Cross 2 x week, fluent in Spanish and French.

Wants to complete OSSD, in the process of switching careers to become a police constable.



Student born in Ontario in 1992 and attended school in Ontario.

Transcript available, 5 credits.

History, geography, Gr. 10 English, Gr. 10 science and Gr. 10 math are missing. Literacy test and community hours NOT complete.

Student is working full-time, and is assisting at a local mechanic shop. Lots of proof of different work experience (restaurants, retail, construction, mechanic shops).

Life skills: parent, budgeting, pays rent and all bills, started saving for school, works out 2 x week, is fluent in another language, takes care of a sick parent, owns a vehicle, maintains oil changes and repairs, loves to work on cars and does minor repairs for friends/ family.

Wants to complete OSSD, and prepare for the Automotive Service Technician apprenticeship.
