



Adult Education Hybrid Learning Project




Phase 4 Project Goals:

- Access to more flexible, cost-effective delivery of senior-level adult, alternative and continuing education credit courses;
- Increased student retention rates in Adult Education Hybrid courses;
- Improved student engagement using technology-enabled learning and teaching.


How many of the newly developed Adult Education Hybrid courses did you implement/utilize in the 2016/17 school year? (Check all that apply)

Phase 4 Results:

- **17** school boards that delivered approximately **428** hybrid courses to over **10,358** adult learners across Ontario.
- At TDSB a comparative multiyear analysis of all hybrid versus non hybrid courses (**2015-16** & **2016-17**) in isolated school years showed statistically significant improvements in retention and achievement.

District School Board East

- Face to face contact had a positive effect on success rates (I.e. credit accumulation) within their voluntary attendance model:
 - **Fully Online - 34% success rate;**
 - **Attended 1-9 days - 44% success rate; and**
 - **Attended 10 or more days - 85% success rate.**

District School Board South-West

- Student Voice Survey (**n=50**) highlights:
 - **48%** of learners were 18-21 years of age
 - **64%** had never taken an online course before
 - **98%** reported that they enjoyed the hybrid learning option
 - **86%** rated their overall hybrid learning experience as ‘Excellent’ or ‘Very Good’

Phase 5 Project Goals:

- To build capacity within Adult & Continuing Education programs, across school boards and regional networks to enable the reflexive exploration of technology enhanced learning and instructional models; and
- To incent collaborative networks and community partnerships to expand access to stakeholders, and provide hybrid teaching and learning services to previously un- or under-serviced areas throughout Ontario.

Adult Dual Credits

- For the **2017-2018** school year there are:
 - **48** approved Adult Dual Credit programs involving **22 colleges** and **55 school boards**.
 - This involves **857** approved **learners** (adult learners over age **21**) working towards earning **1,011** approved **credits**.

Experiential Learning 2017-2018

- **20 district school boards** will be receiving almost **\$750,000** in funding for **30 projects** in the **2017-18** school year.
