Follow Up Questions for Withdrawals - 2013

First Contact

Hello, may I please speak to (name of student)?

[If the individual is not available try to find out when s/he might be available. Explain purpose of study (see below) if requested. Thank the person providing the information. Do not collect survey information from parents, roommates or others.]

[If the individual does not live in this household, try to obtain a new telephone number. Explain purpose of study (see below) if requested. Thank the person providing the information.]

When you reach the former student

Hi, my name is ____ and I'm calling on behalf of (Centre name). We are conducting a survey of students who went to (Centre name). Your feedback will provide the Centre with information about where are students go and give us ideas about how to improve the program. The survey takes only a few minutes to complete. Do you have time to speak to me now?

[Yes- proceed with survey

No- When is a better time to call you back?

Yes – Set Appointment

No – We do have an email option to complete the survey. I can send you a link so you can fill it out at your convenience.

[If the student questions the validity of the study, you might say s/he can contact the persons listed below for verification.]

Before we start, I'd like to assure you that your participation is voluntary. You may choose not to answer a question and you may withdraw at any time. Any information you provide will be kept confidential. In our report, no names will be used and everyone's answers will be grouped together so that no one can be identified. The report will be shared with other educators to help us all understand our students better.

Are you willing to proceed with this interview?

This question may seem odd but it is standard practice to ask this question once the respondent has all the information.

Note to administrators: I suggest open-ended because a comprehensive list is too long to read over the telephone. It is best to SORT the answers into categories afterward when analyzing the survey. Some possible categories are:

Illness/Surgery/ Disability Pregnancy Mental health issues Addiction Learning disability Timing of classes Don't have a computer at home Don't have time to complete assignments Subject is too difficult Insufficient teacher support, help with subject(s) Language barriers Class atmosphere is not right for me Location of school site/transportation Daycare/childcare Family issues/responsibilities Friends/family not supportive Pending court appearance Employment Insurance/Ontario Works approval/timelines **Finances**
