Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition
PLAR for Mature Students

PPM 132 - mPLAR

"A formal evaluation and credit granting process whereby students may obtain credits for prior learning."

- Recognizing and valuing the knowledge and skills students acquire in formal and informal ways
- Goal: help mature students move forward faster, removing barriers
- Key Goal of the Adult Education Strategy
- <u>Different from PPM 129 PLAR for Adolescents</u>



Who benefits from PLAR and how?





Who Benefits from PLAR?

 Adults upgrading for PSE or job promotion need OSSD

 Immigrant students with previous education and learning, need Ontario prerequisites, and OSSD



And now.....

- Secondary students who are at least 18 on or after January 1st of the current school year up (up to August 31)
- Secondary students who are missing compulsory grade 9/10 credits and eligible for work life experience eqv credits
- Students who may have significant gaps due to physical or mental health challenges





PLAR increases Student Success

- Reduces the amount of time required to obtain OSSD
- Makes the OSSD obtainable even to students with other commitments
- Recognizes and honours a student's rich and varied experiences.



Adult Learner Success Story- previous formal education Pathway: Re-training for a New Career, OSSD, nurse

Before:

- Degree in Business from home country, responsible for experiential learning program in former country
- Moved to Canada to be close to children attending post-secondary
- Couldn't find work in her field; didn't have Canadian experience

How:

- Enrolled in adult day class
- Received grade 9/10 PLAR and 11/12 PLAR for out of country transcripts for a total of 26 EQV credits completed OLC4O and community service hours

After:

- Completed all prerequisites for nursing program and OSSD
- Accepted into nursing program, and successfully completed 2 year nursing diploma



18 year old Learner Success Story

Pathway: College Program Business - Marketing, with an OSSD

Before:

• PLAR eligible Student has **18 total credits**, 12 grade 9/10 credits and 6 11/12 credits

How:

- Referral via Re Engagement to Night School in Feb 2022
- Completed 9/10 PLAR and 11/12 PLAR
- Completed 4 Sr Credits including ENG4C, and MBF3C (+Literacy requirement, CSH met)

After:

- Completed all prerequisites for Business Marketing program and received an OSSD by June 2022
- Started College program in September 2022



PPM 132 – Mature PLAR

An *Eligible* student may earn *up to 26*equivalent c*redits

- Up to 16 9/10 PLE (Prior Learning Equivalent) Credits (Through Written assignments or by taking the course)
- Up to 10** 11/12 EQV Credits (Equivalency and Challenge)

The last **4***** credits must be earned

- Grade 11 English (could be ESL or ELD credit)
- Grade 12 English
- Grade 11 Math
- Grade 11 or 12 Computer Studies, Science, Tech or Math (can be substituted)

Plus literacy requirement (course or test) and 0-40 community service hours (principal's discretion)

*up to 29 EQV's (16 9/10, and **13 EQV's) if a student has a completed diploma or degree from an accredited Canadian Post Secondary Institution List of Accredited Canadian Post Secondary Institutions

****** Students with a completed diploma or degree - 1 credit at grade 11/12

The PLAR-Process

1. Intake/Eligibility/Orientation

Application(s)

Determination of eligibility and # of Equivalent credits

2. Assessment

English, Math, Science, Cdn Geography/History (9/10) Evaluation of credentials/documentation – <u>SECA</u> (11/12) 11/12 Challenge

3. Recording

Cumulative Tracking Record, Student Management System

4. Reporting- OnSIS



Step 1: Who is eligible for PLAR?

Mature students who started grade 9 in 1999-2000 (OSS) or later, and new students to Ontario secondary school system after Feb. 1, 2004

- At least 18 on or after January 01 of <u>current</u> school year up to and including <u>August 31</u>
- Registered in a credit course with the purpose of obtaining the OSSD
- And not on track to graduate in June

*<u>eligible <mark>18+</mark> students less than 26</u>

What does this mean???

- A student who turns 18, up to and including August 31, 2023 of the current school year, with 21 or fewer credits, "not on track to graduate"- is <u>NOW PLAR ELIGIBLE</u>
- no break from school is required
- must be registered for the purpose of obtain an OSSD



Step 1: STUDENT IS ELIGIBLE!!!

- Register the student
- Check Mature student/PLAR flag in your student management system (SMS)
- Add Zero PLE (Prior Learning Equivalent credits) to SMS*

The Ministry of Education will provide funding for:

*One grade 9/10 assessment/mature student/fiscal year 0-16 credits at \$130

Step 2: Assessment 9/10 and 11/12 Equivalencies/Challenge

2(a) 9/10 Equivalency

<u>Up to 16 PLE credits – Prior Learning Equivalents</u>

Grade 9 and 10 eqv credits may be granted through:

- •Transcripts from outside Ontario, and/or
- •Completion of individual <u>assessments</u> in:
 - English,
 - Math
 - Science,
 - Canadian Geography and Canadian History

Step 2(b): 11/12 Equivalencies

11/12 Equivalency

<u>Up to 10* EQV credits</u> Grade 11 and 12 credits may be granted through: •Transcripts from outside Ontario, and/or •Validation of appropriate documentation of learning gained through other programs, courses, life and/or work experiences via the Senior Equivalent Credit Application. (SECA) <u>SECA</u>

The ministry will provide funding for :

One grade 11/12 assessment/mature student/fiscal year 1-10 credits at \$130



Challenge Process

The student must provide reasonable evidence that they would likely be successful in the challenge process.

• Certificates and/or other records of accomplishment

Students cannot challenge:

- a course in any subject in which the student has a credit in that subject in a higher grade;
- a course in which the student has already earned a credit (see page 9, PPM132)

• Track PLAR data



- Maintain Cumulative Tracking Records in OSR and/or Student PLAR File
- Enter information into SMS OST

Record Keeping - 9/10 Equivalency Credits

Results of mature student's individual assessments are recorded on the Cumulative Tracking Record form as a Pass or Fail and included in the student's OSR. The Ministry form should be treated the same as a transcript.

- Completed 4 Sr Credits including ENG4C, and MBF3C (Literacy previously completed) and CSH

After:

- Completed all prerequisites for Business Marketing program and received an OSSD by June 2022
- Started College program in September 2022




Guiding Principles of mPLAR


- Respect for the knowledge and skills that mature students have acquired, in both formal and informal ways outside secondary school
