Assessment Process OUT OF COUNTRY

Out of COUNTRY PLAR Assessment: How do you determine which assessments a student must complete?

Students WITHOUT Formal Documentation from another Country:

- All students assessed for eligibility and suitability of PLAR for Mature Students at Intake
 - QUESTION: Did student attend High School outside Ontario?
 - If YES Mature PLAR, regardless of age (18 or older)
 - Must write all 5 PLAR Assessments (ENG, MATH, SCI, HIST & GEOG)

Students with Formal Documentation:

- All students assessed for eligibility and suitability of PLAR for Mature Students at Intake
 - QUESTION: Did student attend High School outside Ontario?
 - If YES Mature PLAR, regardless of age (18 or older)
 - Utilize Mature PLAR process as you would do for a student with a Transcript in Ontario:
 - EXCEPTION: Gr. 9/10 Courses grant all 16 credits
 - Gr. 11/12 Courses utilize PLAR Equivalency Package to garner EQV's
 to be granted

Out of Country PLAR Assessment

Out of Country Resources (With Documentation)

If a student has a transcript and is planning on pursuing post-secondary education, you can recommend they have it assessed through ICAS or WES. They should always check with the college and university first as these institutions have preferences and can be costly.

- <u>WES</u> World Education Services, credential evaluation of recognized institutions (secondary and postsecondary) to comparable Canada or US programs
- ICAS International Credential Assessment Services
- **<u>CICIC</u>** The Canadian Information Centre for International Credentials (Information)

Out of Country Resources (Without Documentation)

If a student is unable to provide a transcript you can have them complete an affidavit, or have the student write all 5 PLAR tests.

<u>Sample Affidavit</u> - An affidavit should be used when a student is unable to obtain original transcripts from their previous country (due to war for example).

- has been volunteering at a local church (every Sunday) for a year (2 hours per week)
- has a PSW certificate

Work Experience:

- 2 years of employment at a local grocery store stocking shelves, completing inventory, working on cash, and greeting shoppers
- 1 year of employment at Tim Hortons serving customers, preparing food, cleaning the kitchen area and restaurant, and balancing cash

### **Students WITHOUT Formal Documentation from another Canadian Province:**

- All students assessed for eligibility and suitability of PLAR for Mature Students at Intake
  - Attended High School outside Ontario?
  - If YES Mature PLAR, regardless of age (18 or older)
  - Must write all 5 PLAR Assessments (ENG, MATH, SCI, HIST & GEOG)

### Students with Formal Documentation

- All students assessed for eligibility and suitability of PLAR for Mature Students at Intake
  - Attended High School outside Ontario?
  - If YES Mature PLAR, regardless of age (18 or older)
  - Conduct a PLAR Assessment:
    - Utilize Canadian Provincial Resources to make decisions on EQV

## Out of Province PLAR Assessment

Education is a provincial matter; in Ontario it is the school principal who makes the final decision
regarding equivalencies. Within Canada, high school credits can be taken at face value. This means that
potentially*** if a student comes from Manitoba to Ontario with 12 credits they would have 12
credits. Marks per se, are not given upon transfer but an EQV coding for the courses are given.







### Out of Province Assessment Scenario #4- Alberta

#### Alberta Education System:

Junior High – grades 7 – 9 Senior High – grades 10 – 12 1 credit = 25 hours A passing mark is 50% A student must obtain 100 credits to attain an Alberta High School Diploma

Grade 9 Curriculum includes: French, English Language Arts, Math, Science, Social Studies, Physical Education and Health and Life Skills

#### **Course Codes:**

The numbers 10 - 19 designate grade 10 courses The numbers 20 - 29 designate grade 11 courses The numbers 30 - 39 designate grade 12 courses

University, college or technical destinations use the following coding: English Language Arts 10-1, 20-1, 30-1 Pure math 10, 20, 30 Sciences with 10, Biology 20, 30; Chemistry 20, 30/ Physics 20, 30 College and technical schools as well as trades use the following: English Language Arts 10-2, 20-2, 30-2 Applied Mathematics 10, 20, 30 Science 10, 20, 30

Math 14, 24 and Science 14, 24 are for students planning to enter the trades or go into the workplace Courses designated 15, 25, 35 are locally developed Courses designated 16, 26, 36 are used for Integrated Occupational Program, which gives students entry-level workplace skills and leads to a Certificate of Achievement.

Promotion of students from one grade to another in Junior High and promotion to grade 10 are determined by the school principal.

#### Junior High School

Students take a minimum of 100 hours in each of the following courses: English Language Arts, French Language Arts or Francais; Math, Science, Social Studies (includes: history, geography, economics, political science), Physical Education & Health and Life Skills, and two optional courses.

#### Questions to consider when completing an "Out of Province" assessment:

- 1. What province did the student come from?
- 2. What does their high school system look like? Junior High, Senior High, Cycle 1 and 2?
- 3. Is grade 9 included on the transcript or does it begin with grade 10? If the transcript begins at grade 10, what subjects are compulsory in the grade 9 program for this province?
- 4. How many hours equals one credit?
- 5. How many credits did the student complete? Was he/she close to graduation?
- 6. After determining the grade 9/10 credits the student has completed in another province; you can decide if any grade 9/10 assessments can be completed in order to top of the grade 9/10 credit count to 16 credits. (Does the student meet the mature student definition?)


