Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition PLAR for Mature Students

PPM 132 - mPLAR

"A formal evaluation and credit granting process whereby students may obtain credits for prior learning."

- Recognizing and valuing the knowledge and skills students acquire in formal and informal ways
- Goal: help mature students move forward faster, removing barriers
- Different from PPM 129 PLAR for Adolescents
- Key Goal of the Adult Education Strategy

Who Benefits from PLAR?

 Adults upgrading for PSE or job promotion need OSSD

 Immigrant students with previous education and learning, need Ontario prerequisites, and OSSD



- Secondary students who are at least 18 on or after January 1st of the current school year up (up to August 31)
- Secondary students who are missing compulsory grade 9/10 credits and eligible for work life experience eqv credits
- Students who may have significant gaps due to physical or mental health challenges

How can mPLAR help?



PLAR increases Student Success

- Reduces the amount of time required to obtain OSSD
- Makes the OSSD obtainable even to students with other commitments
- Recognizes and honours a student's rich and varied experiences.



Key Revisions to the PPM Feb 2022 and September 2023

- New definition of a mature student
- Recognition of Canadian Post secondary credentials including <u>Apprenticeship Certificates</u> issued by Skills Trades Ontario for up to 30 credits
- Three of the final four are now prescribed
- Literacy requirement (course or test)
- CSH (0 40)
- Boards can customize forms found in Appendix 2
- No IEP required to schedule students into GLE30/40 programming for PLAR prep or support

PPM 132 - Mature PLAR

An *Eligible* student may earn *up to 26 or 30 equivalent c*redits

- Up to 16 9/10 PLE (Prior Learning Equivalent) Credits (Through Written assessments)
- Up to 10 or 14* 11/12 Sr EQV Credits (Equivalency and Challenge application process

The Final Diploma Requirements:


Final 4 Senior credits must always be earned

- Grade 11 English (max of 3 credits in ESL or ELD towards the 4 compulsory credits in English)
- Grade 12 English
- Grade 11 or Grade 12 Math
- Grade 11 or 12 Computer Studies, Science, Tech or Math (can be substituted)

Plus: Literacy requirement (course or test) and 0-40 community service hours (Principal's discretion)

*up to 30 EQV's (16 9/10, and *14 EQV's) if a student has evidence of a completed Certificate of Apprenticeship and/or Certificate of Qualification issued by Skilled Trades Ontario and completed diploma or degree from an accredited Canadian Post Secondary Institution

What if they have already completed: a Grade 11 English, a Grade 12 English, a Grade 11 Math, and a Grade 12 Science prior to PLAR eligibility?? Do they need to do any final credits?????

Step 1: Who is eligible for PLAR?

Mature students who started grade 9 in 1999-2000 or later, and new students to Ontario secondary school system after Feb. 1, 2004

- At least 18 on or after January 01 of <u>current</u> school year up to and including <u>August 31</u>
- Registered in a credit course with the purpose of obtaining the OSSD
- And not on track to graduate in June



What does this mean???

- A student who turns 18, up to and including August 31, of the current school year, "not on track to graduate"- is <u>NOW</u> PLAR ELIGIBLE
- no break from school is required
- must be registered for the purpose of obtain an OSSD

*eligible 18+ students less than 26



Step 1: STUDENT IS ELIGIBLE!!!

- Register the student <u>PLAR Intake Notification Form</u>
- Check Mature student/PLAR flag in your student management system (SMS)



- Add Zero PLE (Prior Learning Equivalent credits) to SMS*
- Add student to school generated tracking template

Sr Equivalency Supporting Documentation

- Transcripts from secondary schools, colleges, universities,

- Certificates of qualifications for apprenticeship
- Certificates of participation such as Young Driver's, Smart Serve, Heavy duty Equipment etc.,
- Appropriate documentation of learning that supports the equivalent experiences such as reference letters and affidavits

11/12 Equivalency Process

PLAR Assessor/Guidance, determines whether there is a direct relationship between the documentation presented by the student and the curriculum expectations.

PLAR Assessor/Guidance, determines the total credit equivalency of the student's previous learning and the number of compulsory and optional credits still to be earned.

Credits must represent the same standards of achievements as credits granted to students who have taken the courses.

Skills Trades Ontario (STO) is an agency of the Ministry of Labour, Immigration, Training and Skills Developmentresponsible for apprenticeship and skilled trades certification in Ontario. It was established through the <u>Building Opportunities in the Skilled Trades Act</u>, 2021.

Sample of How a Principal May Grant Up to 30 Credits for Certificate of Apprenticeship or Equivalent

Electrician - Construction and Maintenance (from STO)

(Compulsory, Certificate of Qualification Exam, Academic Entry Requirement – Grade 10)

Plans, assembles, connects, installs, repairs, inspects, tests, verifies, and maintains electrical systems in various settings (i.e., residential, commercial, institutional, industrial).

- 9000 (approximately five years), which consists of 8160 hours of on-the-job work experience and 840 hours of in-school training. (from BOSTA Chart)
- Three levels of theoretical training, which includes, but is not limited to, instruction in: codes, legislation and regulations, blueprints, drawings and specifications, trade communication and documentation, electrical theory, wiring, motor starters and controls, transformers, generators, electronics, conductors and cables, installation methods, instrumentation and power distribution, fire alarm and building systems, high voltage systems, control systems, electrical equipment, maintenance, job planning, grounding and bonding, distribution equipment, protective devices

Do I register the student??

The student would need to be added to a board's SIS to generate a new OST, grant the diploma and report it up to OnSIS. However, how that is done in a board's SIS, may vary depending on the vendor.

Granting 30 credits in your SIS may not be possible until the March OnSIS update.



FAQ re Revision 2?

What if a student has trade certification from outside Ontario???

Skilled Trades Ontario's Trade Equivalency Assessment is the first step towards obtaining a Certificate of Qualification for experienced workers who have not completed an Ontario apprenticeship ..but who have equivalent skills and experience. The Trade Equivalency Assessment determines whether the student can challenge the certifying exam for a trade. If successful in the exam, the student would pay a fee to be issued a Certificate of Qualification in that trade. The Trade Equivalency Assessment is only available in trades with certifying exams.

Step 2(c) Assessment cont'd: Grade 11/12 Challenge Process

- Mature students may challenge up to 10 grade 11/12 credits...
- No more than 10 credits may be granted for Challenge and Equivalency combined.

*One grade 11/12 Challenge/mature student/fiscal year 1-10 credits at \$394



Step2 (c) Challenge Process

The student must provide reasonable evidence that they would likely be successful in the challenge process.

Certificates and/or other records of accomplishment

Students cannot challenge:

- a course in any subject in which the student has a credit in that subject in a higher grade;
- a course in which the student has already earned a credit



Policy Document – PPM 132

<u>"All boards must develop and implement policies and procedures related to the equivalency and challenge processes that are consistent with this memorandum."</u>

Boards must also ensure that a clear statement is published in the school program and course calendars outlining when:

Mature students may undergo individual assessment for the purpose of obtaining Grade 9 and 10 credits

they may also present education and training credentials and/or other appropriate documentation for assessment through the equivalency process for the purpose of obtaining Grade 11 and 12 credits And/or challenge for their prior learning to be evaluated and assessed for the purpose of granting credit for Grade 11 and 12 courses, including what opportunities for challenge are available at schools under the jurisdiction of the board or through partnership with another school board

Boards will determine the time frame for the completion of the four individual assessments for the specific Grade 9 and 10 courses required by students and of the challenge and equivalency processes for the specific Grade 11 and 12 courses required by students.





- 1. Grade 9/10 assessments (up to 16 credits), no course codes
- 2. Grade 11/12 equivalencies (up to 10* credits) course codes –no marks
- 3. Grade 11/12 challenges (up to 10* total equivalencies + challenges) course codes + marks

PPM 129 for regular high school students - 2 parts

Based on out of province transcripts or homeschooling, given as 1 chunk of credits, (PLE1N, PLE3N) no marks, can be granted more than once as student may leave and come back again Up to 4 challenge credits for 11/12
