Months of Recognition - Celebrating Heritage

"Identities and cultures shift, change, and grow as individuals learn and develop at home, school, and beyond. Identities are also woven into each other; they are intersectional. As such, while many students may identify with the same religion or creed, their unique beliefs, practices, and lived experiences produce different narratives. It is important not to impose a 'single story' narrative on our students and their families."

Consideration of Months of Recognition

- When honouring any identity, centre students and families in the conversation
- Remember that no identity is monolithic. Every effort needs to be made to honour the diversity and intersectionality that exists within a community when honouring identities
- Consider how classroom activities might appreciate rather than appropriate a culture
- Educators are encouraged to continually reflect on their own intersectional identities and positionality whenever they are in service to students, families and community

For Example: Summer Solstice 2025
June 19, 2025 - Open Circle Day – no evening events
June 20, 2025 – Summer Solstice - Red Dot Day- No events for the full day

Affirming Intersectional Two spirit and LGBTQIA+ Identities



Create a welcoming environment for gender diverse individuals.



Embrace a curriculum that draws from diverse, intersectional perspectives.



Be explicit about your support. Listen and believe Queer and gender diverse individuals when they share their perspectives.

2SLGBTQIA+



If you aren't sure or are curious about something, don't put anyone on the spot. Just Google it.



Share your pronouns to create a safe space for others to share if they wish to.

Small Changes = Increased Sense of Belonging

Lessons and Documents

Be aware of the language of instruction

 Use clear, literal language by minimizing metaphors and idioms.

 This assists participants who are neurodivergent, as well as those who do not have English as a first language.

Documents

✓ Reduces visual clutter, helping to reduce stress and anxiety

White space and High Contrast Improves comprehension and retention by making text easier to read and identify the most important parts

✓ Improves focus by seeing and approaching one section at a time
