- Must be 18 years of age or older
- Listening and Speaking skills (CLB 5/6)
- Goal Oriented to further education or to a workplace

- Additional Instructor and Project Manager hired
- PLAR / Coop credit courses offered
- Gentle Persuasive Approaches (GPA) course introduced
- Friday Skills class & Placement Component added


